

Social Connection - 98.4% Healthy social connections are consistently and positively associated with all indicators of psychological well-being.

Positive Emotional Experiences - 99.0% People who have positive emotions in their everyday lives tend to be happier, healthier, learn better, and get along well with others.

Psychological and Emotional Skills - 98.9% Skills like sharing emotions, countering negative thought patterns, and mindful acceptance of emotion all contribute to greater mental health and increased well-being.
